



Wisdom Worth Having – Bible Curriculum for 4/5 Year Olds (Pre-K / Kindergarten)

Program Overview

The **Wisdom Worth Having Bible Program for 4/5 Year Olds** introduces young children to the greatness of God and the truth of Scripture in an engaging, joyful way. This curriculum is designed for mixed-age or transitional Pre-K/Kindergarten classes, offering slightly more depth and structure than a pure 4-year-old program while remaining highly interactive and developmentally appropriate.

Core Goals:

- Develop a genuine love for God and His Word.
- Learn foundational Bible stories and the big picture of God's redemptive plan.
- Memorize meaningful Scripture passages.
- Understand basic gospel truths: creation, sin, Jesus as Savior, resurrection, and obedience.
- Grow in simple prayer, worship, and Christian character (kindness, honesty, sharing, obedience).
- Begin to see that the Bible is God's true Word that speaks to our lives today.

Class Structure (25–35 minutes per day)

1. Welcome & Worship Song Time (5–7 min)
2. Bible Story with Visuals (10–12 min)
3. Memory Verse, Discussion & Prayer (5–7 min)
4. Activity / Craft / Game / Review (5–8 min)

Full Year Scope & Sequence

Quarter 1: God the Creator & His Good World

- Unit 1: Creation
 - Week 1–2: God creates the world (Genesis 1)
 - Week 3: God creates Adam & Eve and the Garden of Eden
 - Week 4: The Fall – sin enters the world (simple telling)
- Unit 2: God's Promise to Save
 - Week 5: Noah, the Flood, and God's rainbow promise
 - Week 6: The Tower of Babel
 - Week 7–8: Review & Creation celebration

Memory Verses:

- "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." (Genesis 1:1)

- "God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good." (Genesis 1:31)

Quarter 2: God's People & His Promises

-Unit 3: Abraham's Family

- Week 1: God calls Abraham
- Week 2: God promises a son to Abraham and Sarah
- Week 3: Isaac and God's faithfulness

- Unit 4: Joseph

- Week 4-7: The full story of Joseph (favorite coat, dreams, slavery, prison, rise to power, forgiveness)

Memory Verses:

- "Trust in the Lord with all your heart." (Proverbs 3:5)
- "We know that God works all things for good for those who love Him." (Romans 8:28 – simplified)

Quarter 3: Deliverance & God's Law

- Unit 5: Moses & God's Power

- Week 1: Baby Moses
- Week 2: The Burning Bush and God's call
- Week 3: The Ten Plagues and Passover

- Unit 6: Exodus & Wilderness

- Week 4: Crossing the Red Sea
- Week 5: God provides manna and water
- Week 6: The Ten Commandments (focus on loving God and others)
- Week 7-8: Review

Memory Verses:

- "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid." (Hebrews 13:6)
- "Love the Lord your God with all your heart..." (Mark 12:30 – simplified)

Quarter 4: The Life of Jesus – Our Savior and King

- Unit 7: The Coming of Jesus

- Week 1: Angel Gabriel and Mary
- Week 2: The Birth of Jesus
- Week 3: Shepherds and Wise Men

- Unit 8: Jesus' Ministry, Death & Resurrection

- Week 4: Jesus calms the storm and heals the sick
- Week 5: Jesus loves the children and teaches
- Week 6: The Last Supper and the Cross (gentle telling)
- Week 7: The Resurrection – "He is risen!"
- Week 8: Jesus ascends and sends the Holy Spirit (simple)

Memory Verses:

- "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..." (John 3:16)
- "Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me.'" (Matthew 19:14)

Teaching Methods & Resources

- Use high-quality illustrated Bibles (The Jesus Storybook Bible recommended).
- Incorporate puppets, felt boards, props, and movement.
- Weekly crafts, coloring pages, and simple drama.
- Worship songs with actions.
- Character focus: Connect stories to real-life choices (obeying, forgiving, trusting God).
